Our mission is to enhance novice signed language interpreters' skills and abilities to provide quality and effective communication access to the residents of New Mexico through structured professional development plans, mentored interpreting practice, and exploration of ethical dilemmas.



When does it happen?

We offer a paid yearlong apprenticeship through FY 26, July 1, 2025 to June 30, 2026. This is not intended to be a full-time apprenticeship, but we do have a time commitment expectation (schedule of tentative dates available on request).
