Through an advocacy presentation by Corina Gutierrez and a panel of consumers with lived experience, participants will identify:

Behaviors that enhance Deaf consumers' autonomy, communication access, and self-advocacy

Systemic barriers that commonly arise in interpreted environments

An actionable strategy to foster stronger relationships with Deaf individuals and affirm the privilege of interpreting

As a Master Deaf Self-Advocacy (DSA) Trainer, Corina has led extensive trainings for Deaf and Hard of Hearing community members on how to navigate interpreted settings, communicate expectations, and build effective working relationships with interpreters.
